


# UNIT-I LOOKING AROUND Living and Non-living Things

There are many things that we see around us. At home, in your bedroom there is a bed, a table lamp, fan, light and many other things. Outside, there are buses, cars, stones, houses, trees, plants, animals, birds, flowers and many more.

These things that you see are either living or non-living. Plants and animals are living things. You too are living. But the furniture at your home, utensils in the kitchen, vehicles on the road and the house that you live in, are all non-living things.

- Living things grow old and die
- Living things reproduce. Animals give birth or lay eggs, while plants grow from seeds and other parts.



Non-living things cannot breathe, eat food, feel, grow, move on their own nor reproduce. A train, a car, a ball, a pen, a book, etc., are all non-living things.


# Natural and Man-made Things There are many things found in the nature which are not made by man. These are called natural things. All living things are natural things. Non-living things like the Sun, the Moon and clouds also exist naturally.

Non-living things like rubber, pencil, clothes, house, etc., are not found in nature. These are made by man. They are called man-made things.

- Furniture, utensils, clothes, TV sets, radio, etc., are man-made.




